Lesson Plan: Personal Body Safety

Activity: Let's Talk About Body Boundaries, Consent, & Respect; identifying safety network

Grade(s): CE1 (2nd grade)

Learning Objective(s) (aligns with competency):

- 1. Students will be able to identify which parts of their bodies should be kept private
- 2. Students will be able to list things they can say if someone wants to hug them without consent
- 3. <u>Students will be able to identify safe grown-ups that they can go to if someone else makes</u> them feel unsafe or uncomfortable

Materials: "<u>Let's Talk About Body Boundaries</u>, <u>Consent</u>, <u>& Respect" book</u>; <u>Coloring Pages</u>, <u>Pencils/Crayons</u>, <u>PowerPoint</u>

Procedure:

Adopted from MCPS lessons

- 1. <u>Introduce the lesson topic: "Today, we will be talking about keeping our bodies safe.</u>
 Who knows what it means to be safe?"
- 2. "How do we feel when we are safe?" (Happy, ok, comfortable)
- 3. "How do we feel when we are unsafe?" (Safe, scared)
- 4. Present the PowerPoint
- 5. Read to the class the book "Let's Talk About Body Boundaries, Consent, & Respect". Read pages 4 11, 22 27, and 34 37
- 6. Ask students what they can say if someone tries to touch them without consent
- 7. Review what a safety network is
- 8. <u>Hand students the worksheets. Have them write down or draw 5 people in their safety network</u>
